TriHealth's laboratories operate within federal CLIA guidelines and the regulatory standards of all applicable laboratory agencies and accreditation bodies and comply with state and local laws and regulations. Laboratory operational changes are implemented as needed to remain compliant with all regulatory requirements. TriHealth's laboratories maintain current accreditation by the College of American Pathologists (CAP). Because Bethesda, Inc. and Good Samaritan Hospital are accredited by The Joint Commission, the laboratories at all sites participate in this organization's processes as well.

Quality control measures include the daily use of control samples of serum, blood, and urine in all sections of the laboratories. In addition, the laboratories voluntarily participate in programs of quality evaluation and assurance sponsored by both the CAP and the Ohio State Department of Health. Regular inspections are conducted in accordance with the guidelines for laboratory accreditation established by the CAP.

Equipment and testing methods are selected on the basis of precision and reliability as well as cost-effectiveness. Testing is performed by registered medical technologists and technicians, cytotechnologists, and histotechnicians. Client services, including the pick-up of specimens and delivery of reports, are coordinated by knowledgeable technical representatives. All operations are supervised by our staff of pathologists.
